For many years the Lexicographical Section has promoted research on Medieval Latin Lexicons through the publication of critical editions and commentaries. In this area of scholarship, SISMEL has come to recognize the importance and possibilities inherent in the creation of the Lessici mediolatini, LeMeL database,

which allows consultation and research on a corpus of texts using the resources offered by new technologies. The lexicons now available in Mirabile, in PDF format, permitting basic word searching, represent the first step in a larger project.

### MIRABILE DIGITAL LIBRARY (MDL)

The Mirabile Digital Library (MDL) is a new tool which enhance research at the text level on Latin Medieval Authors. It offers in open access the Latin Medieval Texts published by **SISMEL · Edizioni del Galluzzo** in a new form that allows users to accomplish tasks beyond the simple browsing: the text and related information contained in the edition are remodeled into a system of interconnected and browsable data. The texts are encoded in xml-tei standard. **All metadata link directly to Mirabile repertories** (Bibliography, Authors, Works, Manuscripts) and it is also possible to run filtered full-text searches. The project comprises currently about 190 titles and will be updated on a regular basis.

The MDL, born in cooperation with the repository CORPUS CORPORUM of the University of Zurich, also displays the text-search results deriving from this repository.

The MDL was made possible by a fellowship instituted by the Zeno Karl Schindler Foundation in partnership with the Società Internazionale per lo Studio del Medioevo Latino (SISMEL).
